

Five decades ago a group of visionaries realized that our children have a right to healthy, safe and equitable life. They founded our council with affiliation of Indian Council For Child Welfare. They left us for heavenly abode leaving a great task to carry on.

The entire history of 50 years of this council is the zeal of voluntary enthusiasm to bridge the overarching shadow that darkened the lives of our children and women, a realization of need of dedication to build a non exploitive society for the children and women. We hope such a commitment would continue in the years to come. But we are still far away, far distant, and far in our endeavor 'to care'

On the eve of Golden Jubilee Celebration, so the narration in this 'We Care' is not a presentation of overarching shadow in a golden frame.

While debates about the 'how' of providing for children are likely to continue, the indisputable fact remains that we are lagged behind in all, or most of all, standard norms of child care and riddled in a paradoxical addressing; child mortality decreased in country enchanting activist where in child ratio is decreasing in a alarming rate. Parents exercise parental and tutorial duty but little has been done to counter the joust of consumerism which shattered our social and family relations, collective enterprise is side stepped by individual venture.

In the second half of twentieth century some social scientists held aggressiveness is an essential aspect of evolution and justified control over the weak and helpless.

We are staunch supporter of the counter position to the concept of selfishness. We believe that working cooperatively with other members of the same species is not only natural but also intrinsic to all human or forfeit our right to being known as homo sapiens, the wise man. Wise man do not inflict cruelty on helpless children & women.

However table is set for debate, discussion, contradictions- which side of the table advocates for conferring every right to children is our concern. All of us who are committed to uphold the rights of children weightage must be given to the views of children.

For well being of the children the poor cannot afford to pay for services in areas like education, health and nutrition. Government has prime responsibilities but unfortunately the programmes run by the Government shot through feudal mind set. As for budgetary allocation majority response seems to be for spending higher percentage of revenue collection in social sector. However it is not only children of poor who have a less than satisfactory childhood, many affluent families have problematic environment. One side it is poverty other side it is precept. So we need to focus our attention to physical and social environment of Indian children, their health status, sexual exploitation, labour and their aspiration.

Tripura Council For Child Welfare traveled a long way with passing memory of shadow and light, failure and success, apathy and zeal but journey continued. And will continue and if 'commitment continue to gather momentum the balance must be tipped in the favour of children in difficult years to come...' (Mrs Gita Siddharth, President ICCW).

As per census 2011 there has been a considerable decline in the child sex ratio from 927 (2001) to 919 in the year 2011 (child ratio is the no of female per thousand male in the age group 0-6 years).

"Despite a law to curb female foeticide a child ratio in India has gone down over the last 20 years" – Harshabardhan, Union Health Minister.


United Nations on the rights of person with disabilities (UNCRPD)

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of person with Disabilities (UNCRPD) reflects that disability is a human rights issue that requires deep understanding and strong and specific action.

In all actions concerning children with disabilities the best interests of the child shall be a primary consideration. (Article – 7 of UNCRPD).

Children with disabilities should have equal access to participation in play, recreation and leisure and sporting activities including those activities in the school system. (Article – 30 of UNCRPD).

Persons with disabilities are not excluded from general education system on the basis of disabilities and that the children with disabilities are not excluded from free and compulsory primary education or from secondary education on the basis of disabilities. (Article – 24 of UNCRPD).





CHILD Labour

The vicious cycle

The popular notion that child labour helps improve the economic condition of the poverty stricken families, in contrary, it actually pushes the families into further poverty, and often for generations. Children start working to support family, by the time they are old enough legally to work, they are no longer in a position to do so because of serious work induced ailments. The cycle continues with younger siblings being forced to work in order to support their parents and sick old siblings.



But in the same breath, Indian women continued to face atrocities such as rape, acid throwing and dowry killing and forced prostitution of young girls.


According to UNICEF's state of world children 2009 report, 47% of India's women aged 20-24 were married before the legal age, rising to 56% in rural areas.





Childline reaches out to the most marginalized children with the aim of providing them rehabilitation and care from unsafe situations. Childline provides relief and rehabilitation in the space of shelter, medical aid, repatriation, rescue, emotional support and guidance. So, If you see a child in distress, call 1098.

Tripura council working as support organization of Childline has been doing a job pertaining to child protection issues in Agartala and its outskirt. Performance of support organization as follows:-

- 1) Rehabilitation of a good no. of orphans to different shelter home.
- 2) Medical aids were extended to a few street children and some other economically backward children.
- 3) Rescued a few child labours
- 4) Extended emotional support and guidance to some children members of a broken family
- 5) Rescued some missing children and repatriated them
- 6) Rescued a few abandoned children and arranged restoration to sishugreha in consultation with CWC.
- 7) Prevented one case of child marriage

Special achievements in respect of publicity of child line

The support organization of CHILDLINE under Tripura Council For Child Welfare has been able to pursue and convince the Gomati Corporation Milk Producers union to have a print-out of the logo of Childline in each milk packet which obviously made a wide publicity of childline amongst the urban family of the society.

Sometimes relations in the families are put under strain and family members feel isolated or overlooked and unhappy. Often family becomes a source of inter personal difficulties. In the evolving modern consumers market economy, demands increased by manifolds. The frustration of non-fulfillment of demands reflects in social relations. Conservative relations are also subject to change in changing economic condition. The changes are rapid but society cannot evolve new formation with that rapidity; resulting in broken and fragmented families. 'As a strapped economy jousts with trappings of a consumer economy, where every milestone, every festival, every birth, marriage and death and gift is wrapped in glossy consumerism, the price we pay is life itself.'

Since the family is a system as a whole, neither the individual nor the family is blamed for any problem. They can jointly participate in finding solution. Family counseling can help one understand and cope better with the stress and strain of the family life. Tripura Council For Child Welfare came forward and established its first family counseling centre at Agartala and then another one at Udaipur .


